Please find herewith an outline of the most important general **Terms and Conditions** of the **Springer 2016-2011** e-book subject collections offer via INASP:

- Pricing is according to each countries UN HDI Ranking:
UN-HDI Low = Additional 0.85% discount
UN-HDI Medium = Additional 0.9% discount
UN HDI High = Additional 0.95% discount
Springer prices as listed for your country are the final UN-HDI discounted prices.
- All Prices quoted are a one-off purchase/ownership price per institution (Institutions may choose any Springer Copyright e-book subject collection in their specialized areas)
- Pricing for Copyright Year 2015 -2011 and calculated according to the above model and are available upon request
- N.B. As of Copyright Year 2016 the Springer ebook Subject collections have been expanded from 13 to 20 collections. There are also several changes to the names and specializations of these collections
- Institutions have full ownership, seamless and unlimited access to any subject collection they purchase
- As long as an institution maintains some kind of 'electronic' commercial relationship with Springer there are no additional annual surcharges or IP maintenance fees
- In the case that an institution should elect to no-longer purchase any Springer electronic resources, the Springer standard License Agreement allows for 2-Additional years access to previously purchased content and thereafter an annual maintenance fee of \$500 is chargeable. As above this fee is automatically waived if the institution purchases any one said Springer electronic product each year. (This is the same as the current and all previous Springer-INASP e-journals License Agreements.)
- Above is on the basis of an annual License Agreement with one centralized advanced payment each year to be invoiced via INASP

Additional Incentive

- As an **additional incentive** to any eligible INASP partner institution wishing to purchase Springer e-book subject collections via INASP from Copyright Year 2011 onwards, Springer will grant free access (No Ownership) to the same subject collections for **Copyright Years 2010 – 2005**
- N.B. In the case that an institution purchases all 12 subject collections for any one Copyright Year published between Copyright Year 2010 – 2005, this accounts for five-years free access to in total **20,990 additional titles**
- Should after some time, the institution also wish to have full ownership of these Subject collections, highly discounted 'ownership' pricing is also available for this collection upon request.
- N. B. This Free access only applies to the former Copyright Year 2010 – 2005 Springer ebook subject Collections and is not valid to any Palgrave Macmillan ebook subject collections that are now integrated in the Springer ebook subject collections with the effect of Copyright Year 2016 only.
- Access is for all Copyright Year/Subject Collections per institution as selected and paid for by each individual institution via the INASP Country Coordinator (Annual consolidated payment via INASP).
- Free Access is valid for 5-Years from the date of invoicing thru the end of the Calendar Year. i.e. Any Copyright Year 2016 ebook subject collection purchased in 2016 will enable access thru to 31-12-2021.

Consortia

- In the case of 'Country-Wide Consortium Access' Additional consortium discount will be deducted from each institutions total according to the total number of members participating and each member UN HDI rating.
- In the case that Multiple institutions commit to this offer in any one said country the 'Consortium discounts' per institution (as below: will be applied). This is all on the basis of an annual License Agreement with one centralized advanced payment each year to be invoiced via INASP.
- Consortium Discounts depending on number of participants per Consortium:
 - 1 Institution = 0% discount
 - 2 – 5 Institutions = 12.5% discount per Institution on UN HDI discounted price
 - 6 – 10 Institutions = 15.0% discount per Institution on UN HDI discounted price

N.B. INASP Country Coordinators – It is imperative that you make this offer known to each of your members and send one consolidated order on behalf of all members to INASP. The more members that sign up to this offer the higher the additional 'Consortium' discount to each member according to the e-book subject collections that each member selects for purchase.

- Each Individual institution has to choose those e-book Subject Collections/Copyright Years that they elect to purchase according to their own wishes, curriculum and research at each university and of course according to their available funds
- Annual 1-Year non-automatic online License Agreement via DocuSign with no price increase. In this case Springer make a new price list each year and new annual prices are then fixed in relation to inflation and the number of new titles forecast for each subject collection.
- 3-Year automatic online License Agreement via DocuSign with a fixed 4% annual price increase in second and third year of the License Agreement over previously purchased packages according to the current 2016 INASP price list.
- Centralized administration and one-time annual payment by the Consortium to Springer via INASP
